

The book has an overall nice layout for the chapters, and gradually progresses through some of the notable events in Native American culture, and describes their effects on the social development of the Native Americans. It appears that a lot of time and research went into crafting this book, and that effort is something I genuinely appreciate.

Lobo et al. Produced a wonderful piece in this edition. It confers the problems and concerns of native studies in the colonized world. Particularly issues of identity and sovereignty were highly descriptive. I have referenced this book in further studies after purchasing it for an initial course. As a textbook I

would say it is a good introduction to both the blind who do not see contemporary native issues and the unlearned who do not see how deep they are.
